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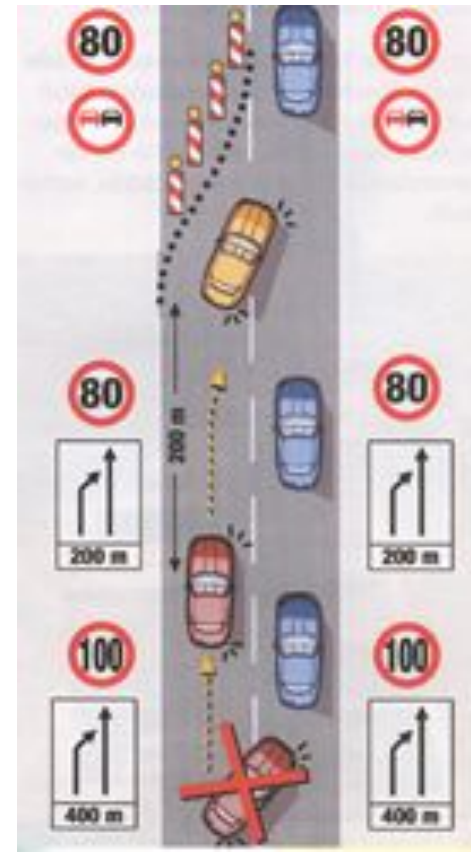

Common Pitfalls and Misunderstandings

- Routine.
- No actions, no change.
- Big items, impossible to tackle.
- Focusing on weaknesses instead of building on strengths.
- No practice with various facilitation techniques.

Common Pitfalls and Misunderstandings

- Retrospectives are not public.
- Not enough preparation by Scrum Master or Project Manager.
- Keep it team and process focus and not “product” focused.

Common Pitfalls and Misunderstandings

- Blame game
- Everyone is happy
- Management involved
- Offline retrospective by email
- Optional attendance
- Too short
- Not facilitated

Fresh New Ideas

- External (organization or coach) facilitation.
- Different rooms, times, locations.
- Combination with other team building activities.
- Use different facilitation techniques.
- Focus on one left-over topic from previous retrospectives. Special theme.
